A walking tour of the Botanical Gardens area will provide a knowledge sharing opportunity to build a better approach to establishing values and managing the area together. Lead by GudjuGudju and the Abriculture team who are passionate about reviving and promoting the ancient connections between people, land & ecosystems based on the philosophy that when the land is strong and healthy its people are dynamic and resilient. Cairns tribal community have survived climate change before and have stories which feature sea level rise, the extinction of megafauna, earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, changing river courses, and changing land and seascapes. Defences have historically been built against sea level rise, erosion and aided the creation of the Great Barrier Reef which exists still today. Their living knowledge could benefit the current community facing these same issues now.

Students looking to learn about the water industry and Water Professionals who wish to learn from GudjuGudju regarding thousands of years of important custodian knowledge.

### SITE TOUR TWO: WASTE EDUCATION

Cairns Regional Council is the only council in the FNQROC region on the Tier 2 waste levy pathway where the annual advance payments will reduce year on year until it reaches 20% by 2030/31, making Cairns the only council significantly impacted in 2026 if no post Bedminster solution is in place. To respond to this challenge, the Resource Recovery 2040 Roadmap will develop a detailed business case to move Cairns towards the 2030/2040/2050 state targets. A key part of supporting targets is the recently invested \$15M in a state-of-the-art Material Recovery Facility.

The Material Recovery Facility has some of the latest optical sorting and screening processes in Australia – which the team were required to liaise with overseas contractors to ensure the machines were commissioned to operate at their optimal capacity. The Resource Recovery Precinct recovers and recycles almost 20,000 tonnes of Recycling each year from the Yellow bin and the Container Refund Scheme.
